Dear Patient,

Enclosed is information about how to prepare for your colonoscopy. <u>Please read these instructions as soon as possible as some medications must be stopped a week before your procedure.</u>

For a successful colonoscopy your colon must be clear of stool, allowing your doctor to visualize the inner surfaces of the colon. Failure to follow these instructions limits the value of this procedure and your colonoscopy may need to be rescheduled.

You will be sedated for this procedure, and unable to drive until the next day. You must bring a driver who can stay with you the entire time you are here and drive you home. Failure to do so will result in your colonoscopy being rescheduled. Free wireless internet is available in our waiting room for guests to use.

We strive to stay on schedule. Our goal is to begin your procedure within one hour after the arrival time noted above. Your expected time at the endoscopy center will be 3 hours or less. Please arrive on time with completed paperwork. You will be delayed or moved to the end of the schedule if you fail to do so.

As a courtesy to other patients and to our staff, we require at least two business days' notice for cancellation or rescheduling of procedures. Please see the financial policy included in this packet for more details. Call our office at (629) 255-2154 with any questions.

Expect to receive a call from a nurse one week prior to your procedure. This is to confirm your appointment and answer any questions you may have. You may also receive a survey phone call after your procedure. Please take the time to provide feedback so that we can continue to improve. We are honored by the trust you are placing in us and appreciate the opportunity to serve you.

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- A. If you take **blood thinners** and have not spoken with a nurse at our office regarding holding this medication, please contact us as soon as possible. If you are unsure, please call and speak with a nurse in our office. A few examples of blood thinners are listed below:
  - Coumadin (Warfarin), Plavix (Clopidogrel), Xarelto, Eliquis, Effient
- B. If you have an **implanted pacemaker** or **defibrillator** and have not spoken with a nurse regarding this, please notify our office.
- C. **If you are diabetic who relies on insulin**, please call the physician who manages your diabetes for advice on how to regulate your medication during you prep and on the day of your procedure.
- D. **If you take any GLP-1 medications for weight loss/diabetes**, please stop these for **two weeks** prior to your procedure. See the table below for the list of GLP-1 medications.
- E. Please see the table below for which medications to stop taking before your procedure:

- E. Continue using any prescribed inhalers and bring them with you to your appointment.
- F. Purchase the following supplies (Available without a prescription at any pharmacy or drug store)
  - One 10 oz bottle of Magnesium Citrate (any flavor)
  - Two 7 or 8 oz. bottles of MiraLAX powder (or generic polyethylene glycol 3350)
  - Gas-X tablets
  - Two 32 ounce bottles of Gatorade or enough Gatorade to equal 64 oz. (any color except red)
    - Diabetic patients and patients concerned about sugar intake should purchase G2 Gatorade in any color
- G. For three days before your procedure:
  - Do not eat corn
  - Do not eat breads or crackers with seeds
  - You may have fruits and vegetables, but do not eat the seeds or peelings

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THE DAY BEF	ORE YOUR COLONOSCOPY
Morning	<ul> <li>Clear liquids only all day. No solid food. Clear liquids include: water, cola beverages, coffee (no milk or cream), tea, lemonade, Kool-aid, broth, Gatorade, apple juice, white grape juice, white cranberry juice, Jell-O (any color but red).</li> <li>Drink at least 8 oz. of these liquids every hour between 8am &amp; 2pm. It is very important that you stay hydrated.</li> <li>Mix one bottle of Miralax into each bottle of Gatorade. Shake the solution until the Miralax dissolves and refrigerate if desired.</li> <li>*DO NOT START DRINKING THE PREP YET*</li> </ul>
2:00 PM	Drink the 10 oz bottle of Magnesium Citrate. Continue clear liquids.
4:00 PM	<ul> <li>Take two Gas-X tablets.</li> <li>Drink the 1st 32 ounces of the Gatorade/Miralax solution at a rate of 8-10 ounces every 10-15 minutes until completed.</li> </ul>
8:00 PM	<ul> <li>Drink the 2<sup>nd</sup> 32 ounces of the Gatorade/Miralax solution at a rate of 8-10 ounces every 10-15 minutes until completed.</li> <li>If you have nausea/vomiting, the rate can be slowed down to every 30 minutes as long as your prep is completely consumed by midnight.</li> </ul>
THE DAY OF	YOUR COLONOSCOPY
Morning	<ul> <li>Do not eat or drink anything after midnight. Do not use chewing tobacco or smokeless tobacco of any kind on the morning of your procedure. Failure to comply with these directions will result in delay or cancellation of your procedure.</li> <li>Take your necessary medications at least 2 hours prior to the procedure with only enough water to swallow the pills.</li> <li>Wear comfortable clothes that are easy to put back on and wear socks to keep your feet warm. Do not wear jewelry, apply lotion to the chest area, or wear contact lenses unless you can sleep in them.</li> </ul>

#### Please bring the following to your appointment:

- An updated list of medications and dosages (or bring your medications with you)
- A responsible adult who must stay in the waiting room and drive you home
  - You must not operate a motor vehicle until the following day
  - We cannot start preparing you for your procedure unless your driver is present
  - This person will help you remember what the doctor tells you about the results
- Two forms of ID *or* one photo ID (driver's license, passport, etc.)
- Your insurance cards
- **Fully completed** forms that are included in this packet


Main entrance is on 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue North.

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#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

• Do I have to take two bottles of MiraLax? I am a small person, and my pharmacist told me I only needed one bottle.

The size of a patient has nothing to do with the amount you must take. A small female can have the same length of colon as a large man.

### • There is not enough room in the Gatorade bottle for all of the MiraLax. What should I do?

Pour the Gatorade into a pitcher and then add the MiraLax; or if you do not have a pitcher large enough, pour a little of the Gatorade out and then add the MiraLax.

#### Can I mix the MiraLax with something other than Gatorade?

No, Gatorade has the proper electrolytes to prevent the body from absorbing the MiraLax/Gatorade mixture and to keep your body's electrolytes balanced.

#### Can I take the prescription prep if I prefer?

Yes. Please call our office to speak with a nurse and have this sent to your local pharmacy.

#### Is there a substitute for Magnesium Citrate?

Yes, you can take four (4) Dulcolax laxative tablets in place of the Magnesium Citrate.

### • Why can I not drink red Gatorade?

When the red color comes through the colon it can look like blood and can hide any bleeding that might be present thus compromising the exam. Red G2 is fine as the color is less concentrated.

#### Going to the bathroom so much has made my bottom raw. What can I do about that?

Use disposable wet wipes to clean yourself. You should not use any lotion, ointment, or Vaseline before the procedure.

#### • What if I start vomiting while drinking the prep?

Wait 30 minutes and slow to half the recommended rate.

### • Why do I need to arrive 60 minutes early for my appointment?

It is important you arrive early to check in, complete additional paperwork, change clothes, have an IV started, and speak with the doctor and anesthesia provider. We appreciate your cooperation.

#### Why do I need to stop my GLP-1 medication?

These medications work by slowing your gastric emptying process resulting in you feeling full quicker. If you do not stop the medication prior to your procedure, it can result in severe nausea during your prep, an inadequate prep, or aspiration (inhalation of stomach contents) during your procedure.

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#### PATIENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

You and your family should be as comfortable as possible and know that YOU are our number one concern during your visit to Digestive Disease Endoscopy Center. The following statement of your rights and responsibilities is presented as the policy of this facility but does not presume to be a complete representation of all-mutual rights and responsibilities.

#### YOU HAVE THE RIGHT:

- To impartial access to the medical resources of the center without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, handicapping or disabling condition, spiritual or ethical beliefs or source of payment.
- To change providers if other qualified providers are available.
- To receive considerate, respectful care, which recognizes your personal dignity at all times and under all circumstances.
- To participate in decisions involving your care. Except in an emergency situation, you shall not be subjected to any
  procedure without your voluntary, competent and understanding consent or the consent of your legally authorized
  representative.
- To refuse treatment to the extent permitted by law and to be informed of the consequences of that refusal.
- To information about Advance Directives, such as Living Will or Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care, that
  would allow you to make your own health care decisions for the future and to have your chosen representative
  exercise these rights for you if you are not able to do so.
- To instructional and educational information about your medical treatment in a language and terms that you understand
- To the confidential treatment of and personal access to your medical record.
- To know who is responsible for providing your direct care and to receive information concerning your continuing health care needs and alternative for meeting those needs.

#### YOU HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY:

- To give your doctor and the staff complete and accurate information about your condition and care. To follow instructions of your doctor and the staff of the center and to keep appointments relative to your care.
- To make it known whether you clearly understand planned actions and treatment and what is expected of you.
- To report unexpected changes in your condition to your physician or staff. To accept the financial obligations
  associated with your care.
- To advise your doctor or any office staff member of any dissatisfaction your may have regarding your care.
- To be considerate of other patients and of staff members who are caring for you.
